This document will help you to get started using the computer systems within the Deanery of Biomedical Sciences. All new staff and students joining the Deanery should read this document in full.

Contacting the IT Services

Getting your login details.

If you have not already received your login, then please contact Laura Thomas to obtain your UUN & password - <u>Laura.Thomas@ed.ac.uk</u>. The username & password we supply will gain you access to any University-managed desktop or Active Directory computer. It is also needed for setting up your EASE access.

Accessing EASE.

EASE is a web-based authentication method used throughout the University and is a prerequisite for using email, Webcentral, library services etc. This should be the first task you carry out once you have access to the network. Please visit the following link to register.

Click the link to "Set up Your University Login" and enter your UUN or matriculation number and password as per the document supplied. Make sure you accept the University's computing regulations. Now continue to the next step. If you forget your password it can be very difficult to recover it if you do not remember the questions and answer you gave, so you might want to take notes. Follow the onscreen instructions to completion. Once completed you now have access to EASE-enabled services. To clarify EASE is NOT the same as Active Directory. EASE is generally used for web based services and AD is for computer and network services.

Office 365

Microsoft's Office 365 suite combines email, calendar, OneDrive file storage, Office Online apps and Skype for Business, as well as other collaboration products available to all University staff and students.

Changing passwords

This task is not required, we only describe the process here for your information. As mentioned EASE and Active Directory are separate and we do recommend that you keep your passwords separate as well. To change your AD password when using a supported desktop computer press CTRL ALT DELETE you will see a button to 'Change a password'. To modify your EASE password visit *www.ease.ed.ac.uk* and click on the relevant link. Make special note of the tick for **Also set Windows (Active Directory) login password?** Do not tick this if you wish to keep your EASE and AD passwords separate, as per our recommendation. You should use a strong password; names, dictionary words etc. are not considered secure.
