 - o Talked about her role as CMVM Data Manager (CDBS/CCBS) supporting full life cycle of research data management including:
 - Data management plans
 - Data protection impact assessments (DPIAs)
 - Data sharing collaborations (proportionate data governance*)
 - Data transfer advice and support (proportionate data governance*)
 - [*working with research contracts]
 - Active data management (including DataStore)
 - Policies/procedures within/out with the UoE
 - Next steps include:
 - Continuing to engage with researchers through the intent to submit process
 - Devise induction process for new starters, postgraduate research and PhD student
 - Streamline leavers process
 - o Data management survey summary:
 - 67 responses overall, c.38 from CDBS
 - Analysing the qualitative feedback
 - Emerging key findings include:
 - Faster access to DataStore required
 - Better availability of/responses from Information Services
 - Input from data manager roles throughout research lifecycle
 - Curated and coordinated policies/procedures/guidance and training
 - Next steps include:
 - Keep abreast of space availability on CDBS-SIDB DataStore, and provide updates to BMS Head and/or the exec, to avoid running out
 - Continue meeting with researchers and project teams
 - Trial drop-in sessions and inductions programmes
